An embodiment of the benefits of afterschool tutoring, Jose Perez was selected as a recipient of the 2019 Suzanne W. Schirber LaAmistad Scholarship. He will enter his freshman year at Oglethorpe University this fall. Having attended Afterschool for nearly his entire academic career, Jose credits LaAmistad with encouraging him to reach his full potential. "When I had doubts, LaAmistad was always there to remind me how important my education was." There was a time, following a series of family hardships, when Jose wasn't sure if he would pursue higher education. A time when he romanticized dropping out of school and following the path of some of his peers. "I would tell my mother that school just wasn't for me," he recalled. LaAmistad refused to give up on this remarkable young man. With the help and support of volunteer tutors and community leaders, Jose is now college-bound. A gifted athlete, Jose will lace up his cleats for the Stormy Petrel soccer team as he pursues his degree in business.



Alondra Juarez

Alondra Juarez was a LaAmistad Afterschool student from 2005–2012. She attributes her desire for higher education to the values instilled in her by her family, particularly her mother, as they often worked side-by-side throughout her upbringing. "I get my work ethic from [my father] a construction man and [my mother] a self-employed housekeeper," Alondra wrote, "the last thing I wanted to do on a summer day is wake up at 7 in the morning [...] [my mother] brings me along to show me what quitting school really looks like." Fiercely ambitious, Alondra never lost sight of her goals, "I always take a peek at the home office to see their degrees. I remind myself that maybe one day I will be able to own a house like this, and be able to provide my children with the same education that was granted to me." Alondra will attend Loyola University New Orleans this fall.

A Holistic Approach to Afterschool

The benefits of afterschool tutoring for students from disadvantaged socioeconomic backgrounds are consistently reinforced by hard data. Nationwide, the most successful programs are those that effectively integrate elements of mental and emotional education with traditional afterschool tutoring and academic support. According to a study published in the Journal of Health Education & Behavior, outcomes for students correlate positively with holistic afterschool program attendance. "Youth who received more components [...] reported more psychological empowerment and prosocial outcomes." There is more to learning than memorization and test-taking, and LaAmistad Afterschool is committed to enhancing all aspects of its students' educational experience.

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When the approach expands to include families, schools, and whole communities, results improve even more. LaAmistad's Parent Partnership program aims to sustain the engagement of families by offering workshops on a variety of topics from financial management to providing a healthy diet. We are proud to connect families with other local organizations that specialize in areas like health insurance, scholarships, domestic violence, and financial services. Additionally, LaAmistad staff members themselves serve as advocates for students in the Atlanta, DeKalb, Fulton, and Cobb school systems, actively helping to raise awareness about the needs and challenges facing Latino youth.

Juan Rosales

When Juan first enrolled in the kindergarten program at Briar Vista Elementary in 2015, neither he nor his mother spoke any English. With the help of an interpreter, his teachers discovered that Juan had never been placed in a school environment before, and thus helping him to reach the proficiency level of his classmates would be an uphill battle. After about a year of working with the ESOL team, Juan's communication skills improved enough for him to be promoted to first grade. It was then that his mother decided Juan could benefit from the academic support and remediation of an afterschool program like LaAmistad. Now, Juan is greeted every Tuesday and Thursday at Clairmont Presbyterian Church by volunteers who are invested in his success. One-on-one tutoring is making a noticeable difference in his academic achievement. Juan's reading fluency has improved steadily since he entered the program, and the support of specialists and volunteers continues to help him grow and develop as a student. LaAmistad is committed to being with Juan every step of the way on his academic journey, and to providing him and his family every advantage possible to succeed in school and life.

Emory University School of Medicine

Building Opportunity One Student at a Time

The goal of LaAmistad's English for Successful Living program is to provide members of our community with convenient, practical, affordable English language classes to improve employability, social interaction, and overall quality of life.

Learning a new language can be daunting, especially without moral support and encouragement from teachers and peers. LaAmistad ESL strives to foster an environment in which adult language learners feel comfortable enough to speak loudly, make mistakes, and build their confidence together.

English for Successful Living continues to rank as one of the largest community-based adult ESL programs in Georgia, with over 350 unique students taking part in the last year. We have established new partnerships with like-minded organizations who believe in our mission and desire to offer the immigrant population in their community the opportunity to become self-sufficient and learn English through LaAmistad ESL.



ESL Student Spotlight

Veronica Dias

Veronica Dias was exceptional long before she ever set foot in the United States. A legal professional by trade, she emigrated from her native Brazil less than one year ago in hopes of greater opportunity and a higher quality of life. "Most people don't consider this," Dias

remarked, "but it's always a challenge when you come to the US from abroad. We need to survive. Many Brazilians come and are too busy working [to take English classes]." When she arrived in Atlanta with her nine-yearold daughter, Dias had difficulty finding work as a result of her, then limited, English fluency. Her mother, who had taken the LaAmistad ESL course and always spoke highly of its benefits, advised her that enrollment in the program would make finding work easier and allow her to be more comfortable in her new surroundings. "I live in Woodstock," Veronica laughed, "No one really speaks Portuguese here, so to be understood I felt like I needed to get better with my English."

With some English already under her belt, Veronica began ESL at level 4 and was surprised by how supportive and understanding people were when she told them she was taking classes. "If I were shy I think it would be harder," she said, "but now I know that people can understand me, and they tend to understand and tend not to judge."

Crediting the hard work and conversational focus of her instructor at Holy Innocents Episcopal Church, Veronica now feels she has the language tools she needs to take her next step. "I'm so glad you have this program," she beamed, "please keep doing this beautiful work."




While the main office for the ESL program remains at its original location, faithful stewardship and a thoughtful, layered approach make ESL at the South Cobb Recreation Center a program to watch.

Learning and Fun in the Sun

Beginning as a partnership with The Westminster Schools in 2012, the goal of LaAmistad's Anímate Summer Academy is to provide students the opportunity to continue their academic growth while school is not in session. Studies show that the "summer slide" (a phenomenon signified by the loss of the academic gains of the previous school year) disproportionately affects minority students and students from low-income families. LaAmistad's Anímate aims to provide participants with a summer camp experience on par with that of their higher-income peers.

Today, LaAmistad's Anímate Summer Academy continues to thrive. Our longtime partners at The Westminster Schools graciously donate the use of their campus and encourage the service of their students as counselors and mentors for Anímate campers. Our newest location at St. Martin's Episcopal School grew again this year, helping nearly 50 students to hold onto their progress and have fun doing it.

Students in LaAmistad's Anímate Summer Academy split time equally between academic lessons and summer camp activities. Mornings are spent on a variety of proven curricula in both English and Spanish, while afternoons are filled with swimming, arts, games, and confidence-building activities.




Soccer in the Streets

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LaAmistad Estrellitas

Established in 2007, Estrellitas ("Little Stars") is a Junior League of Atlanta (JLA) program whose mission is to educate, empower, support and inspire young Latina girls by teaching them life skills, equipping them to be confident decision-makers, and encouraging them to reach their full potential.

After identifying a lack of programs in the Atlanta area that address the high numbers of Latina teen pregnancies and high school dropout rates, the JLA created this educational program to offer support to Atlanta's Latina girls during the critical period of transition from adolescence into early adulthood. It comprises a series of workshops coordinated by JLA volunteers built on maintaining the young woman's sense of identity, which is grounded firmly in an understanding of their cultural heritage. Program topics include self-esteem, education/ career planning, and leadership development. In 2013, Estrellitas merged with LaAmistad, Inc. and now leverages the support and expertise of both organizations.
